Accomplishment	Fatal Decision Program
	This program is through the District Court, Juvenile Probation and the Pickens County Board of Education. This is a real life re-enactment of an automobile accident involving students. The program takes place at one of our local high schools. It is coordinated with the board of education, juvenile probation, ALEA, first responders and air evacuation.
	Law enforcement bring in a wrecked automobile and local students get in vehicle to re-enact an auto accident. When all the high school students from each school arrive and get seated, they see the wrecked car with the students. A few minutes later, sirens are heard from all around as first responders and law enforcement and the ambulance arrive at the scene. Minutes later, the air evac helicopter flies in and lands near the accident and one student is taken to the helicopter.
	At that point, all students go inside for a program regarding distracted driving given by Alabama State troopers and the Bridge Program.
