What is the unemployment rate of your county?	6
What is the percentage of households receiving some type of public assistance?	34
Please describe access to higher education and job training in your county.	The BOE offers dual enrollment with Bevill State and Shelton State CC. We have a local Bevill college in Carrollton.
What are the 3 largest employers in your county?	Pickens County Board Of Education, Pickens County Commission, Hospital, PECO farms
Please describe the types of jobs available.	Very few jobs are available in Pickens County. Most are very low wage paying jobs that don't allow a family to get out of poverty. Logging, lumber yards and chicken industry are large employers. The hospital also has higher wage paying jobs.
Please describe the workforce.	The majority of the workforce are not adequately prepared for the available jobs. The majority of the college educated workforce commutes from Pickens County to Tuscaloosa County or to Columbus, Mississippi. Both of those areas offer greater paying jobs and jobs that require higher education and training.

Please describe the factors that have led to the above trend(s).	Cell phones, the internet and social media are big factors in the increase of our student's sex crimes. Pornography from the internet or the students sexting or sending pictures of themselves has greatly increased. Our drug cases and violent crimes are the same as the past, maybe even lower. The kids have so much access to bad information or pictures and this is a major reason for the increase in sex crimes. Pornography pictures and sexting has become a major problem.
What are the causes of teen accidents or deaths?	Distracted driving Inexperienced drivers
What is the biggest challenge to teen safety?	In Pickens County, social media and the internet are a major issue with sex crimes. Also texting or drinking and driving.
Are gangs a significant and/or growing threat in your county? If yes, please describe how the problem is being addressed.	Yes. Pickens County Juvenile Court has partnered with the Alabama Gang Coalition. The Juvenile probation officers are working directly with the coalition and the BOE to address these problems. The BOE has had speakers come in and educate the students regarding gang activity and how to handle those issues. Juvenile probation is heavily involved with local law enforcement to address this issue.

Our JPOs are highly involved with our BOE. We have a great relationship with the BOE and meet with them often to discuss the increased gang activity and our concerns.

We also provide ACT work keys and the REACH program implements the Compass Learning also. Aliceville High School had a 94% graduation rate, Gordo High a 93% and Pickens County High a 79%. The Compass Learning is active in all 3 schools and has helped with the graduation rate.
