Society had developed a picture that often is not as true as real life and the adjustments are hard for the teenage to cope with. Having a better understanding of coping skills would assist in developing a framework of how to manage decisions, and face consequences in a more positive direction.

Program within our county, working with 13-21-year-olds that have entered the Juvenile System. Our Clients are referred by the following organizations: DHR, juvenile system, and community referrals. C.O.I.N. provides a support net for the clients that enter the judicial system. Over the last three years, we have only had 3 clients that have reentered the program. We have had 1 that did not complete the program. We have had 4 get their high school diploma after dropping out of school due to being virtual/COVID. We have had 2 complete their GED. Other accomplishments are several getting their learner's permit, getting summer and part-time jobs, buying their first car, and not being truant in school for a complete year. Which is a very good thing!!!
